

Framework for the People's Party of New Zealand

Introduction

The **People's Party of New Zealand** (PPNZ) was founded by Mr. **Alani Fisher Taione** with the vision of creating a political party that is truly representative of the people, for the people, and by the people. The Party is built on the principles of equality, justice, and empowerment, aiming to serve the people of New Zealand, regardless of their gender, race, belief, or social standing. This framework outlines the guiding principles, governance structure, operational procedures, and strategic objectives that will help the Party achieve its vision for a fairer, more inclusive society.

The People's Party of New Zealand is committed to advocating for all New Zealanders, addressing key areas of concern that affect the wellbeing of every individual, family, and community across the nation.

1. Guiding Principles

The People's Party of New Zealand is built upon several core principles that shape its policies, decisions, and operations:

- **Equality:** Every individual has the right to be treated fairly and with dignity, irrespective of gender, race, socioeconomic status, or other differences. This value drives the Party's commitment to equal opportunities for all citizens.
 - **Justice:** The Party advocates for social, economic, and legal justice, ensuring that all members of society, especially the most vulnerable, have access to protection, resources, and opportunities that allow them to live fulfilling lives.
 - **Integrity:** The Party values transparency, honesty, and accountability. All Party members, leaders, and elected representatives must operate with integrity and make decisions in the best interest of the people of New Zealand.
 - **Community and Empowerment:** The Party seeks to foster a sense of community, collaboration, and mutual respect. It is committed to empowering people at all levels to take an active role in shaping the future of the country.
 - **Sustainability:** The Party recognizes the importance of protecting New Zealand's natural environment, tackling climate change, and ensuring sustainable development for future generations.
 - **Democracy:** The Party believes in the power of democracy, where the people have the ultimate say in their governance. This includes transparent elections, free speech, and the right to participate in decision-making processes.
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2. Organizational Structure

To ensure the Party's effectiveness and alignment with its guiding principles, the People's Party of New Zealand is structured as follows:

A. Founder and President

- **Role:** Mr. **Alani Fisher Taione**, the Founder and President, holds this position for life. His leadership, vision, and values are central to the Party's identity and direction.
- **Responsibilities:** The President is responsible for setting the strategic direction of the Party, representing the Party at national and international levels, and ensuring alignment with

the Party's mission. The President has ultimate authority over major decisions but will work collaboratively with other Party leaders and members.

- **Succession:** The position of President is only open for election upon Mr. Taione's death or voluntary resignation. In the event of temporary incapacity, the Vice President assumes the role of Acting President.

B. Vice President

- **Role:** The Vice President assists the President and takes on leadership responsibilities when the President is absent or incapacitated.
- **Responsibilities:** The Vice President is involved in Party operations, policy discussions, and supporting regional leaders and members. The Vice President is also responsible for stepping into the President's role temporarily when needed.

C. Central Committee

- **Role:** The Central Committee is responsible for overseeing the daily functions of the Party, including strategy, policy, communications, and administration.
- **Members:** The Central Committee is composed of key Party leaders, including the President, Vice President, General Secretary, Treasurer, and elected Regional Representatives.
- **Responsibilities:**
 - Overseeing policy development.
 - Managing the Party's internal affairs.
 - Approving key decisions and Party positions.
 - Ensuring financial accountability and transparency.

D. General Secretary

- **Role:** The General Secretary is responsible for the administrative functions of the Party.

E. Treasurer

 - Ensuring that regional concerns are communicated to the Central Committee and the President.
 - Organizing and participating in regional campaigns and events.

3. Membership

A. Eligibility

- **Membership:** Any New Zealand citizen or resident who shares the Party's values of equality, justice, and empowerment is eligible to join.
- **Rights:** Members have the right to vote in Party elections, participate in policy development, and stand for Party office (except for the role of President).

B. Membership Subscription Fee

- **Fee Structure:** To support the Party's operations, all members are required to pay a **membership subscription fee**. This fee is aligned with New Zealand's standard political party fees to ensure fairness and accessibility for all.
 - **Standard Membership Fee:** NZD \$20 per year.
 - **Low-Income Membership Fee:** NZD \$10 per year (for students, beneficiaries, or individuals facing financial hardship).
 - **Family Membership Fee:** NZD \$50 per year (for households with more than one adult member).
- The membership fee is designed to cover administrative costs, support the Party's activities, and ensure the Party's sustainability.
- **Payment Process:** Fees can be paid via online bank transfer, credit card, or through authorized Party events. Fees are due annually and can be renewed online or by mail.
- **Fee Exemptions:** In cases of financial hardship, members may apply for a temporary exemption from the subscription fee, subject to approval by the Central Committee.

C. Membership Process

- Interested individuals must submit a membership application to the General Secretary, which includes personal information and agreement to abide by the Party's Constitution and By-Laws.
- Applications are reviewed, and membership is confirmed by the Central Committee.

4. Major Fundraising Events

- **Purpose:** The Black Tie Ball will serve as the flagship fundraising event for the Party, attracting high-profile donors, community leaders, and political figures. It provides an opportunity to celebrate the Party's achievements and rally support for its future.
- **Format:** The event will include a formal dinner, speeches from Party leadership, live entertainment, and an auction of donated items and experiences.
- **Revenue:** The Black Tie Ball will generate significant funding through ticket sales, sponsorships, and auction items, ensuring a robust financial foundation for the Party.
- **Date:** This event will take place annually on **Labour Day weekend**, a time traditionally associated with social justice and workers' rights.

B. Annual Easter Weekend Dinner

- **Purpose:** The Annual Easter Weekend Dinner will be a more intimate, yet equally significant, fundraising event aimed at building stronger relationships with supporters while raising funds for the Party's operations.
- **Format:** The event will feature a formal dinner with guest speakers, including notable Party figures and external experts, who will discuss the Party's policy goals and vision for New Zealand's future.
- **Revenue:** This event will generate revenue through ticket sales, special donations, and contributions made by attendees who wish to support the Party's work.
- **Date:** The event will be held every year over the **Easter weekend**, aligning with a time of reflection, renewal, and community.

C. Weekly Fundraising Initiatives
